REPORT OF THE ACTIVITIES OF IQAC 2019-20

The IQAC spearheaded the quality initiatives by organising various programmes for the stakeholders in the academic year. The IQAC in association with the Staff Association organized a training session for faculty on the topic 'Quality Enhancement in Higher Education through NAAC Accreditation- The Role of Teachers' by Prof Dr.T M Joseph, Principal, Nirmala College Muvattupuzha on the 6th of July 2019.

IQAC conducted meetings with Core committee members along with individual Staff representatives of all the NAAC parameters to consolidate the data collection and compilation process and clarified the doubts from July 6-15 2019.

IQAC initiated Curriculum reforms for introducing Revised Blooms Taxonomy (RBT) in the Syllabi and organized workshops for the faculty at various phases.

The importance of Outcome Based Education (OBE) increased significantly with the latest NAAC Manual which has been implemented from 01.01.2020. As per the new Manual of NAAC, OBE, Documentation of student activities and ICT enabled innovative teaching methods have become vital components of assessment. Two faculty members from each department was given training on OBE by Prof N J Rao and Prof Rajanikant, Bangalore from 25 to 26 October 2019.

The IQAC co-ordinator further provided an orientation to the whole staff on developing the outcomes on 20 November 2019. Accordingly the departments charted the POs, PSOs and COs of the various programmes. The POs of the institution were developed after a common brainstorming by the IQAC which was later approved.

A further training session on Outcome Based Education was given to all faculty members by Dr Rani Maria Thomas, IQAC Coordinator on November 20 2019.

Two hands on training programmes were conducted for the teaching staff by IPSR on 30 November 2019. 100 members of faculty participated in the programme were clarifications were given according the specificity of each programme.

The second training was given to selected faculty members on 14th of February where the departments presented their outcomes and were given guidance on how to arrive at a course and programme specific outcome. Around 40 faculty members participated in the IQAC room to present the outcomes derived. They then provided the feedback to others to develop the course and programme specific outcomes.

A Session on 'Contemporary Developments in Law relating to Violence and Discrimination against Women' was organised for the students in the William Hall on November 8, 2019 by Dr. Sr. Suma Jose SD.

The IQAC in collaboration with the International Students Facilitation Centre (ISFC) of Assumption College selected five students to represent the College in the SAKURA Student Exchange Programme that is fully sponsored by the Japan Science and Technology Department to visit Universities and Laboratories in Japan for a duration of (up to) 10 days in October 2019.

Three teachers were assigned and asked to meet the parents to analyse the difficulties faced by the differentially abled students and asked them to prepare an action plan for their welfare as part of the IQAC initiative walk with the specially skilled.

Student Satisfaction Survey was conducted on March 20, 2020 and the report was given to the Principal for taking the necessary action.
