On 28th June; the programme Officers and Volunteeer Secretaries attended a meeting with the office bearers of VazhapallyPanchayath for the conduct of Jaivam camp. On 29th July, Saturday, an Inhouse Workshop was conducted for the NSS Volunteers who were shortlisted for the Jaivam camp.

On 26th January the NSS Unit celebrated the Republic Day of our nation. The national flag was hoisted by the Principal, Dr.Sr.Amala SH at 8.00 a.m in the college quadrangle. The NSS volunteers and NCC Cadets performed several programmes.

SEVEN DAY CAMP

The NSS unit of Assumption College, Changanacherry organized Annual 7 day camp –Jaivam 2017 at Vazhapally GramaPanchayath from 31st August 2017 to 6th September 2017.An orientation session on Jaivam was provided to the volunteers even before the commencement of the camp which was led by P Sreekumar and Ms.Aswathy Satheesh on 26th August 2017.Planning and preparatory sessions were held in Panchayath office, Vazhapally.

Eighty Nine NSS volunteers actively participated in the camp. The camp members stayed within the College campus and commuted from the college campus to the various survey sites. Our NSS unit assigned 11 wards in order to conduct the Jaivam survey.

The official inauguration of the camp was conducted on 1st September, Friday at 9.30 a.m at Assumption College Auditorium. Ms. Lizmol Joseph, NSS Programme Officer delivered the welcome address. The camp was inaugurated by Mr. Sebastian Mathew Manamel, Municipal Chairman, Changanacherry Municipality. The Principal of Assumption College, Dr.Sr. Amala S H presided over the function. Mr.Sunny Mathew Changankery, President, Vazhapally Gramapanchayath delivered the felicitation address. Various ward members addressed the gathering during the inaugural ceremony. Ms.Atheena Menon G, Volunteer Secretary delivered the Vote of Thanks. At 11.00 a.m; the NSS volunteers started off for their survey to the various wards in VazhapallyGramaPanchayath. The volunteers were divided into 11 major groups and subdivided into smaller groups of 3 or 4. We got sincere and generous support from the President of VazhapallyPanchayath and other concerned office bearers. The ward members provided great help in directing the volunteers. The Kudumbasree workers too lead the volunteers by helping them with the direction and making other arrangements.

Each volunteer had an overall target of 50 to 60 houses to cover through the survey. They made their presence felt in the concerned wards by lifting banners of Jaivam 2017 and circulating and distributing the brochures, notices and booklets related to Jaivam. The volunteers made good use of their tough time to the hundreds of houses inorder to propagate the message of Jaivam to the overall target of 4000 houses within the

11 wards:1-8 wards and 19-21 wards. The volunteers were motivated and boosted by the good response they got from the family members of the houses they covered. They went to see the Organic farms constructed by many among the households in the Panchayath which were well maintained and produced a good yield. They interacted with good promoters of Organic farming within the Panchayath. The volunteers wholeheartedly invited them to the Valedictory function of the Camp on 6th September.

The Camp day started with Yoga performance at 6.15 a.m in the morning. The volunteers had their breakfast at 8.00a.m in the morning. Later the volunteers gathered together for a camp assembly at 8.30 a.m; in which they presented the Camp Newspaper. The volunteers were divided into several groups with specific functions to perform. Later; by 9.30 am; the volunteers would get ready for the survey.

The volunteers after the survey would reach back college by 4.00 pm in the evening. They had their tea at 4.30 pm. At 6.30 pm; the volunteers would again gather for the Cultural Programmes. After the supper; the team would again gather at 8.30 pm. The day's evaluation was conducted during this phase. The day ended with a prayer at 10.pm.

There were classes and Seminars for the NSS volunteers throughout the camp days by various renowned speakers from various fields. A class on Organic farming was given by Mr.Joseph George, Agricultural Officer, VazhappallyGramaPanchayath on 02.09.17 at 5.00 p.m. A Class on Mindmapping was delivered by Dr.Sr. Lino Margaret on 03.09.17 at 5.00 p.m. Another session was led by Fr LijoKuzhipallil on Life Skills on 04.09.17 at 5.00 pm. The NSS volunteers celebrated Onam with the destitutes at St.Vincent Poor Home, Changanacherry. A Session on Journalism was led by Mr. JosekuttyKuttemperoor, a veteran Journalist.

Moreover many university officials visited our college camping site to evaluate the functioning of the camp. Mr.SanthoshThampy, Coordinator, NSS, MG University; Mr.Sreekumar, Coordinator, Jaivam and Mr.Tomichan Joseph, Member, Syndicate had visited our camping site.

On 6th September 2017, the volunteers had set up an organic farm at the premises of St. Mary's UP School, Thuruthy. Saplings of trees and vegetable seeds were sown by the volunteers.
